

FACILITY REGULATIONS

- Guest groups who agree with the policies of CBM/Camp Grace are scheduled on a first come, first served basis.
- We reserve the right to schedule another guest group simultaneously if facility capacity allows. If your group is the only one here, our schedule is as flexible as you desire. If there is another group here, we will do our best to coordinate the schedule to best use the space and facilities that we have.
- Guest groups should be individuals of Christian character or be willing to live within the guidelines of Christian principles and the specific standards established by Camp Grace.
- Camp Grace is a facility dedicated to the glory of God. Therefore, we recommend that you include a spiritual emphasis time in your schedule (a Bible study, devotional, or chapel service). We'd be happy to help you with this!
- Camp Grace does not discriminate based on race, color, gender, or national origin.
- A reasonable ratio of qualified adults to children/teens must be maintained at all times. All activities must be supervised by a responsible adult.
- Camp Grace does not maintain a resident nurse except during the summer camp season. Guest groups will need to provide for their own medical needs.
- Any act of intentional vandalism or destructive, injurious, or mischievous behavior may result in immediate dismissal from the camp and/or assistance from the local authorities as deemed necessary by camp management.
- No illegal drugs, alcoholic beverages, or weapons of any kind are allowed on the camp property.
- Camp Grace reserves the right to ask anyone with unacceptable behavior to leave.
- Park all vehicles in designated parking areas only. Vehicles are not to be used as transportation within the facility.
- The SPEED LIMIT is 15 mph inside the camp entrance and 7 ½ mph on the inner loop.
- Shoes are to be worn at all times except at the waterfront.
- Smoking is not allowed in any of the buildings. Cigarette butts should be put in the trash and NOT on the ground.
- No children/teens are allowed to be near the water or on trails without a responsible adult chaperone.
- No one is allowed to swim without permission from camp administration and the certified lifeguard on duty.
- All cabins, restrooms, meeting areas & grounds shall be kept in proper order at all times by the group using them.

All arrangements for your group will be made through you, the GROUP LEADER. Open communication between you and the camp staff is very important. We appreciate you and consider it an honor to help make your event a success.

- Before arriving, it is the responsibility of the group leader to:
 - send or fax a schedule of activities
 - have your insurance company send or fax a Certificate of Liability
 - verify and confirm # in group and details of the event prior to your arrival
 - inform all members of your group of the Facility Regulations
- During your stay, it is the responsibility of the group leader to:
 - help ensure the observance of the Camp Regulations by each member of your group
 - communicate with the camp staff regarding your needs and how we can assist you
- Before departure, it is the responsibility of the group leader to see that the following is carried out:
 - each guest has all of his/her belongings
 - the cabins, restrooms and meeting areas are swept clean
 - bagged trash is transferred to the outside receptacles
 - the grounds are left neat, clean and free of matter foreign to the area
 - all borrowed equipment and materials are returned
 - any breakage or loss is reported to camp management
 - final bill is paid at check-out

HOUSING:

- No boys are allowed in the girls' cabins. No girls are allowed in the boys' cabins.
- No pets allowed.
- Smoking is not allowed in any building.
- There must be at least one responsible adult rooming & providing supervision in each cabin.
- **Check-in** is any time after 2:00 p.m. and **Check-out** is no later than 11:00 a.m. unless other arrangements are made prior to your visit. Special arrangements may result in additional charges.
- Evening curfew is 11:00 p.m. unless special arrangements are made with camp administration. This means that everyone is expected to be in their cabin by 11:00 p.m. and quiet by midnight.

DRESS CODE: The purpose of the dress code is to help maintain the intended atmosphere at Camp Grace. It is not our desire to police this code, but we reserve the right to enforce it as deemed necessary.

- Shirts: no inappropriate slogans; no cleavage, bra-straps, or tummies showing
- Shorts: should fall at least halfway between hipbone & knee, no writing on the seat
- Jeans: no writing on the seat or inappropriate holes or tears
- No undergarments showing
- Modest, **one-piece** swimsuit (A dark cover-up must be worn over two-piece suits at all times.)
